Dialogue and Universalism is published by Warsaw University, with the co-operation of numerous authors from the Polish Academy of Sciences. Our periodical is an organ of the International Society for Universal Dialogue and a forum for the presentation of the outcome of assorted studies, views, and discussions.

D&U is frequently associated with the scientific, intellectual, and metaphilosophical movement known as universalism, conceived as a metaphilosophy. Nonetheless, the periodical always has been, and continues to be primarily a medium of the academic and philosophical milieu in **Poland, Europe, and within the academic community of the world**. From its very beginning 30 years ago, the chairman of the Editorial Board has been Professor Jan Szczepański, former president of the International Sociological Association.

The monthly boasts numerous publications by foreign scholars. Many of them sit in the International Interdisciplinary Council of *Dialogue and Universalism*: among them are several Nobel Prize laureates. Our authors include acclaimed scholars, creators and intellectuals, e.g. Prof. Venant Cauchy, honorary president of FISP, Umberto Eco, Vaclav Havel, Leszek Kołakowski, the Dalai Lama, and Andrzej Walicki.

The journal's research and publication tasks entail integration and differentiation of complementariness, synergy and perspectives of open syntheses of the sciences as the foundation of contemporary metaphilosophy, logical problems of "meta-languages", metatheory, metaphilosophy and crucial categories accentuated by universalism: unique and radically non-eclectic, dialogue-oriented world outlooks. This makes us one of the few English-language philosophical journals which actively participate in contemporary cultural, social, and political changes, undertaking a task of philosophical interpretation of the contemporary world as well as initiating important discussion.
